They make a significant contribution to the development of their culture, language, crafts, mutual enrichment, strengthening the feeling of a multi-ethnic single family. It should be noted that this is the first step towards ensuring the right of this category of citizens to receive the pension enshrined in our Constitution.

At the same time, in 2019, Mehr-1 and Mehr-2 humanitarian operations were successfully carried out, and 261 people, mainly women and children, were repatriated from the conflict zone in the Middle East and Afghanistan and provided with medical and material assistance. Speaking of human rights in Uzbekistan, the fact that 9,692

people have been granted Uzbek citizenship over the past three years, including 5,868 in 2019, is a positive development.

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The work carried out in our country to form a culture of respect for human rights and freedoms in society, thereby further enhancing the international prestige of our country, is recognized worldwide. This requires more serious thinking about the need to be constantly sensitive, alert and vigilant in the work being done to ensure peace and tranquility in our country.
